Pick-up: Sunday, 11:00 a.m.

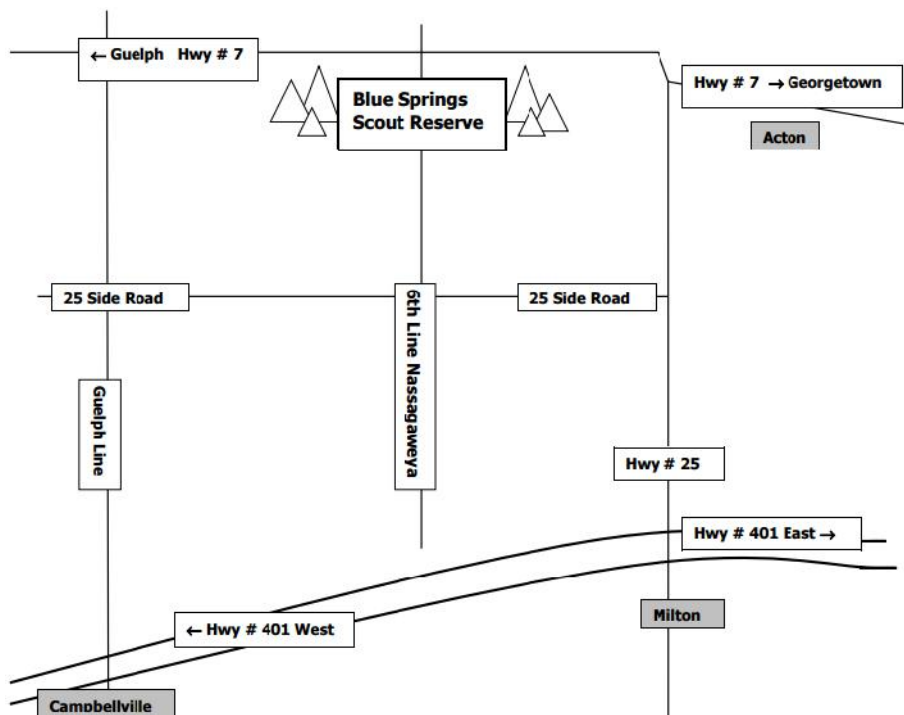
Note: Please pick-up your child on time.

Direction: From Toronto

- Take the 401 West past Mississauga and past Oakville until you get to Milton.
- Take regional Hwy #25 north from Milton for about 10 minutes until you get to side road # 25
- Turn left on side road #25
- Follow side road #25 west for about 5 minutes until you reach 6th Line Nassagaweya
- Turn right and drive for about 3 minutes. Blue springs main gate #14014 will be on your right hand side

CODE OF CONDUCT

I am personally responsible for my behaviour at the **7th Markham Fall Camp**. I understand that each Beaver, Cub, Scout and Venturer has the privilege to learn more about Scouting and to enjoy all of the camp activities. In order to make sure this privilege is observed, I will:

1. Show respect to all Leaders, Beaver Scouts, Cub Scouts, Scouts, Venturer Scouts, staff and guests.
2. Put safety first by listening, paying attention and following leaders instructions promptly and respectfully at all times.
3. Use only appropriate language—any foul, profane or cursing words are not acceptable.
4. Follow the "Hands Off" policy—physical or verbal abuse and fighting or threats against another person is absolutely prohibited.
5. Respect other people's religious, cultural and personal beliefs.
6. Take care of my own equipment.
7. Respect at all times the following:
 - a. Other Scout's personal property
 - b. Group equipment
 - c. Campground equipmentVandalism and/or carelessness of the above listed items will not be tolerated.
8. Be responsible for the repair and/or replacement costs of damages to any property or equipment that I break or lose whether accidental or not.
9. Be helpful to others and work as a team.
10. Have a "buddy" at all times.
11. Always ask for permission before attempting to do something I am unsure of.
12. Always carry my knife permit whenever I have my knife with me (applicable to Scouts and Venturer Scouts).
13. Demonstrate good Scouting spirit and follow the Promise, Law and Motto. There will be zero tolerance for temper tantrums and anger outburst at the camp.

If any of the above rules are broken, the incident will be reviewed by the camp leadership. If the behaviour/incident is found to be unacceptable, the parent will be called to come and get the participant to be taken home at your own costs with no refund for fees and other costs associated with the activities. The camp leadership's decision is final.
