#### Note:

- Please drop off your children no earlier than 5 minutes before the scheduled meeting.
   <u>DO NOT</u> drop off your children at the curb or by the door of the location. You have to go inside the hall/gym with your children and make sure that there are at least two Scouters present. If only one Scouter is present, you have to stay until another Scouter shows up.
- 2. Please pick up your children promptly. The church and the school requires us to leave the premises five minutes after our allocated time slot. We will not let your children out of the hall/gym unless we see you (or someone designated to pick them up).
- 3. Most weekly section meetings will occur at the location listed above. When meetings and events are held at other locations, we will inform you when and where, as well as of any specific clothing or equipment required.
- 4. Parents are responsible for transporting and/or arranging for transport of their children to and from Scouting activities.
- 5. A pair of non-marking indoor shoes is required. Youth must change to their indoor shoes during wet or snowy days and their boots left outside the door of the hall/gym.

#### **Scouters**

This year 7<sup>th</sup> Markham Scouts celebrates its 35<sup>rd</sup> anniversary! We have several very talented and committed Scouters who have moved through the Scouting sections with their children and have even remained with our group even after their children were no longer participating in the program. We are always looking for new Scouters. Being a Scouter is exciting, educational and lots of fun. To become a Scouter, you don't need to have experience in the Scouting movement. Working with youth is a definite asset but you already have that experience as a parent. Training is offered to all Scouters and paid for by our group. Training courses can take place over an evening, a full day, a weekend, or at the camps we undertake for the youth. There is a host of online learning available – some mandatory, some optional. The benefit to you is that you are helping your own youth as well as others, plus this leadership experience is exceptionally rewarding and fun. ## Registration

Registration fees cover the cost of:

- Training materials and resources for Scouters (parent volunteer)
- Planning programs and activities for youth (these must be planned meticulously to ensure compliance with insurance and health standards)
- Publications and handbooks
- Providing service and support to 20 Councils across Canada
- Volunteer servicing expenses
- World Scouting fee
- Risk Management

Dollar for dollar, Scouts Canada's programs provide significant value to its members. Programs run all year long and include many adventures such as camping trips that kids will remember for a lifetime. Most importantly, Scouting makes a difference in the lives of children, youth and young adults. They are more likely to demonstrate greater self-confidence and optimism about what the future holds. They express a strong sense of civic responsibility and have a desire to "pay back" the community. They become more physically fit, energetic, outgoing, conscientious and compassionate.

With the registration fee you paid, only \$25 to \$50 goes to 7<sup>th</sup> Markham which the group uses to pay for administrative expenses (e.g., police checks, neckerchief and Group and Council badges), section weekly badges and group events.

#### **Fundraisers**

With some great adventures, come great costs. This is an important reality that creates great learning opportunities for our youth. As the fall season begins and our Scouting year ramps up, we will need our youth to help find financial support for camps, events and even some of the theme nights they will plan and organize. Throughout the Scouting year, we will be actively doing some fundraising to help make their adventures a reality. These fundraisers ensure we have adequate funds to provide the badges and other awards, craft supplies, a portion of the camping and event funds, leadership training and uniforms, and other items required to ensure the group gives the youth the best possible program.

#### **Apple Day**

This is a key fundraising event where 100% of the net proceeds are returned to the supporting groups in direct proportion to their participation. Please mark your calendars now for *Friday*, *October 11*<sup>th</sup> or *Saturday*, *October 12*<sup>th</sup>. Most information will be distributed in early October about this event. You should plan to set aside two hours from Friday night or Saturday morning or afternoon to participate with your Beaver, Cub or Scout in giving out apples at a local mall or public activity place.

#### Trail's End Gourmet Popcorn

Popcorn is our largest of fundraiser and we continue to increase our sales annually. <u>Our goal is to have each youth sell at least \$500 worth of product on residential routes, to family, friends, and co-workers of parents.</u> The popcorn fundraiser generally runs from second week of September to third week of October. The Popcorn Guide which includes the order form and prize recognition sheet are distributed at the first weekly section meeting of the scouting year.

Remember, we do fundraising for three equally important reasons;

- It is a principle of the Scouting movement that members learn the importance of working together to earn money for the things that they wish to do.
- It gives the youth the opportunity to meet with other members of our Group as well as their own Section members in a different setting, serving a different purpose.
- Our Scouts get out in the community and visibly demonstrate what Scouting offers.

# **Group Events**

The 7<sup>th</sup> Markham Scout Group has a number of events which all sections participate in. When all sections get together, the youth see what the other sections are doing and what they will be doing when they get a little older.

In addition to the regular weekly meetings, we schedule a number of Section and Group events. For example, Cubs will have the opportunity to attend two to three overnight weekend camps at a number of locations where Cubs can work on their skills. Each section will have its own schedule.
